#### **NICKY'S VISIT TO NEPAL**

In January of 2024, Nicole Solis, one of NCM Canada's Project Managers, visited Nepal.

Visiting the Nazarene Churches in the West districts and learning about their needs and strengths. Nicole travelled with the District Superintendent, Rev. Ganga Mukhiya, and the NCM country coordinator, Rev. Machindra Samsohang. They visited 20 churches in both rural and remote communities, conducting interviews with local pastors, leadership and community members. This visit allowed both NCM and the National church to further understand how we can support local churches.



Following up with our FLIP project. FLIP stands for Food & Livelihood Improvement Project. Nicole was able to interview beneficiaries as the project was preparing to wrap up. One of the participants, Mr. Deepak Gurung, shared that before the project he struggled to remain food secure, however, 3 years later, not only can he feed himself and his family but he also sell' a portion of his harvest. With his profits, he can cover other necessities such as school and medical fees. "Thank you NCM Canada for bringing this project to my community. I have learned a lot and I hope to keep learning so that I can keep improving" says Mr. Gurung.



#### **COMPLETED CFGB PROJECTS**

Two large 3-year projects were just completed in March of 2024. One project was implemented in Bangladesh and the other in Nepal. Both projects addressed food insecurity, and targeted the most vulnerable in both contexts. Some of the project activities included:

- Facilitating improved farming methods workshops (ex. creating organic pesticides and fertilizers).
- Providing farming inputs such as tunnel houses and irrigation systems.
- Equipping agricultural groups with revolving loans so they can start their own business
- Strengthening the relationship between government and community.

Both projects were implemented with and through the local Nazarene church. These projects opened opportunities for the church to build trust and establish its presence within predominantly non-Christian communities.

#### **LEARNING TOUR 2024**

Visiting an international context allows participants to be able to experience first-hand the connectedness of the Canadian church to the global ministry of the Church of the Nazarene through compassionate ministries.

Participants of this trip to Malawi, Africa included seven adults, representing four of the five districts in Canada. Sanghmitra (Sam) Lamirande (Canada West District), Stephanie Austin (Canada West District), Edward Kenny (Canada Atlantic District), Gail Visser (Canada West District), Vanessa Manroop (Canada Quebec District), Nicole Solis, NCMC staff, Coleader (Canada Central District), Alan Cristales, NCMC staff, Co-leader (Canada Central District).









Participants attended Sunday service at Ndaula Church of the Nazarene where our Conservation Agriculture (CA) projects began. On the grounds of this church, they also visited the first water well installed by NCMC in Malawi. After service, participants met with students of the surrounding Child Development Center's and helped serve a local meal to about 300 students. Participants also had the opportunity to visit Zukuma, which is a remote community in the north side of the country. There, they visited several projects funded through NCMC and also heard for themselves how community member's perspectives of the church have changed over the years.

Since returning to Canada from Malawi, participants have all had the privilege and opportunity to share their experiences at their local Nazarene church. Thank you to all those who have reached out and invited them to speak about the work of the church through NCM Canada. We are excited for future church engagements, and for assembly season, where our participants have been invited to also share about the Malawi Learning Tour. Be sure to take a moment to say hello to them if you are attending the Atlantic, Quebec and West District assembly in June 2024.
